



# The Great Train Robbery of 1963:

This month marks the 60th anniversary of the Great Train Robbery, one of Britain's most notorious crimes which continues to provoke fascination.

Those connected to the train robbery were a 15-strong gang of thieves, crooks and conspirers.

The most famous member is Ronnie Biggs, who escaped from London's Wandsworth prison in 1965.

Bruce Reynolds planned the robbery and, as a result, has become one of the most notorious criminals in British history.

Also involved were:

- Ronald Edwards: believed to have wielded the instrument used to hit the train driver over the head. In 1994, he was found hanged in a garage.
- Charles Wilson: was in charge of splitting the loot between the robbers. Wilson was nicknamed "the silent man" because he refused to say anything. He was shot and killed in 1990.
- Roy James: served 12 years in prison before being imprisoned again in 1993 for assaulting his wife and her father. He died shortly after being released.
- Brian Field: made the arrangements for the farmhouse hideout that was used immediately after the robbery. He died in a car crash in 1979.
- Gordon Goody: jailed for 30 years and moved to Spain after release.
- James Hussey: served 30 years in jail and later opened a restaurant in London's Soho.
- Roger Cordrey: jailed for 20 years, serving 14 on appeal.
- James White: Spent three years on the run before being caught and sentenced to 18 years.
- Bobby Welch: Served 30 years in prison and was released in 1976.



- Bill Boal: After being caught with £141,000, Boals was charged with receiving stolen goods and jailed for 24 years. Reynolds claimed Boals was not involved in the robbery.
- John Wheater: A solicitor who was convicted of conspiring to pervert the course of justice.
- Leonard Field: Served 25 years in prison.

What happened to the Great Train Robbers? Most of them have now died.

Biggs decided to return to Britain to face arrest after becoming very ill. He died in December 2013 at a care home in East Barnet, London.

After being released from prison, Reynolds published Autobiography of a Thief in 1995 before dying in February 2013.

Edwards returned to selling flowers outside Waterloo station after being released but was found hanged in 1994.







Safeguarding

I completed the Coach Bowls Safeguarding Adults Module in July and the following is an overview.

Adult Safeguarding aims to Prevent harm and reduce risk of abuse and neglect to adults and

safeguard adults in a way to support them to make their own decisions.

Promote and approach to improve lives for adults with vulnerabilities.

Raise public awareness so people play their part in preventing, identifying and responding to abuse or neglect.

Provide information and support to help people understand the different types of abuse and how to stay safe.

It was stated that being vulnerable or having vulnerabilities are usually prior to being classed as an adult at risk. Vulnerabilities make an individual more likely to be abused and therefore at risk. Being vulnerable does not have to be forever and statistics indicate

25% of people are vulnerable at any one point in time.

Vulnerabilities include financial problems, poverty. Physical illness or disability, alcohol or substance abuse or dependency, mental wellbeing and mental health difficulties, sensory loss (particularly sight and hearing), learning difficulties and neurodiversity (autism, ADHA, dyspraxia, dyslexia).

An analogy for safeguarding is driving a car -having safeguarding in place is like having the MOT, tax an insurance and being proactive. Safeguarding protection of adults at risk is the airbag going off and reacting to something that has happened.

I ask you to consider the questions we were asked

- 1) Why do you play bowls?
- 2) Do you feel safe playing bowls at your club?
- 3) Would a new member feel safe?



Some types of abuse can be prevalent at a bowls club, examples discussed are as follows

Physical violence – a punch up on the green, slamming doors and throwing things if losing.

Psychological abuse – humiliation of a player by another, bullying is peer to peer, abuse is where one has a position of power over another e.g. skip to other team players, an experienced player to a new player.

Financial/Material abuse - compulsory raffle, partner controlling finances.

Discriminatory abuse – selection procedures, women serving tea and washing up afterwards.

Sexual abuse – kissing rather than shaking hands at the end of a game.

Organisational abuse – are the correct procedures in place, just because its always been done that way doe not necessarily make it right.

Who is most vulnerable?

Tracey a 24-year-old girl with Downs Syndrome, who is living independently and volunteers in an area of deprivation and gang related crime.

OR

Ben a 24-year-old man in hospital recovering from surgery who has requested a drink and requires assistance but no one has responded.

A few facts

During 2022-23 587,965 safeguarding concerns were raised – a 9% increase on the previous

year, which was 9% on the year before that and 7% on the year before that.

32% of the risks were identifies as Neglect and Acts of Omission, the most common category and 47%.

A growing area of abuse is Financial and Material Abuse, of the safeguarding concerns raised in this area 17% of the victims were in contact with their family, friends and neighbours less than once a week, the average of the victims being 75.

53% of people targeted by scams are 65 and over and only 5% of victims report the crime, many are unaware they are victims.

Answers to the questions among the group on training were as follows

- 1) Competitiveness, enjoyment, socialisation, fitness into later life
- 2) Most of the time, even the majority of the time, but the use of language kept being raised as an issue, not necessarily 'bad' language more about dated views and people speaking before thinking about how things could be received.
- 3) Probably, but there was a general acceptance that more could be done to improve clubs, from the general environment, to making a more welcoming entrance, to providing mentors, more information on who's who and where to go for an answer to something.

With regards to Tracey and Ben, both are potentially at risk, with Tracey we are making assumptions about her ability and the community she lives in, the levels of support she has etc but with Ben he is at immediate risk of dehydration as he is unable to take a drink for himself and the organisation is doing nothing to help him.



It was also stated that each club should have 1 Safeguarding Officer by 2025 but that good practice would be to have 2, preferable 1 male 1 female so everyone has a choice as to who to go to if they have concerns. If anyone is interested please let me know.




Whitesnake is the seventh studio album by English rock band Whitesnake, released on 23 March 1987 by Geffen Records in the US, and by EMI Records in the UK one week later. It was co-written and recorded for over a year in what would be the first and final

collaboration between vocalist David Coverdale and guitarist John Sykes, the final album to feature longtime bassist Neil Murray and the only album with drummer Aynsley Dunbar. The album, besides its commercial success, is remarkable for the band's change to a more modern glam metal look and sound, and the first recording to use the band's new logo which would characterise them in the future. This, for me, cemented my digital creativity in graphic arts and enquired my mind towards communication in the arts which became a separate entity in graphic design know as visual art and communication.

The band's new logo and cover artwork was worked on by Coverdale and a Canadian graphic artist Hugh Syme. Based on Coverdale's idea, he says "I worked with a fine, graphic design artist called Hugh Syme... a Canadian chap... Very gifted... We connected on a very positive, creative level... I discussed with him all the elements I wanted to have in the presentation...a new logo...an emblem, a Celtic, runic style amulet that looked ancient, like it had been here forever, but, still maintained immense power... All the symbols within the emblem represent only positive energies... Sun, Moon... fertility... Yes... a little 'humpty dumpty' in there, too... check out the interlocking snakes... they are Definitely getting to know each other! But, no negatives... no black magic nonsense... It seemed to work..."

Initially the album was released worldwide with different titles, tracklists and by different record labels. In Europe and Australia, it was titled 1987 and included two extra songs absent from the North American version, "Looking for Love" and "You're Gonna Break My Heart Again", while in Japan the album was released as Serpens Albus with the North American tracklist. The 20th and 30th anniversary remastered reissues have a common tracklist, including the additional tracks.





Music

The album was a critical and commercial success around the world, eventually selling over 8 million copies in the US alone and thus being certified 8x Platinum by Recording Industry
Association of America (RIAA) in February 1995. It peaked at No. 2 on the US Billboard 200 for ten non-consecutive weeks, barred from the top spot by three different albums, including Michael Jackson's Bad, and was more weeks in the Top 5 than any other album in 1987. Whitesnake was the band's highest-charting album in the US and peaked at No. 8 on the UK Albums Chart.

Four songs were released as official singles, "Still of the Night", "Here I Go Again '87", "Is This Love", "Give Me All Your Love ('88 Mix)", and one as a promotional single, "Crying in the Rain '87". Among them, "Here I Go Again" and "Is This Love" are the band's most successful charting hits, topping the Billboard Hot 100 at number one and two respectively. The album's success in the US boosted its predecessor, Slide It In (1984), from Gold to double Platinum status by RIAA, and would see the band receive a nomination at the 1988 Brit Awards for Best British Group and at the American Music Awards of 1988 for Favourite Pop/Rock Album.

The supporting tour for Slide It In came to an end in January 1985, when Whitesnake played two shows at the Rock in Rio festival in Brazil. After the band's performance at the last show, drummer Cozy Powell left the group. After almost ten years since David Coverdale had started his solo career and formed Whitesnake, he was actually about to fold the band. However, executives at Geffen Records asked Coverdale to continue working with guitarist John Sykes, as they saw potential in the two. Whitesnake had previously signed with Geffen for distribution in the US and Canada only, while in Europe they remained with EMI.
