

Jest Day **June 1, 1935** — There were about one and a half million cars on the roads of Britain in 1934, but despite the low number, more than 7,000 people were killed in road accidents. Something had to be done, and it was.

Parliament decided that anyone driving a car had to prove they could do it safely and the first compulsory driving test was introduced on 1st June, 1935. Those who had not passed the test were required to display L (for learner) plates on their vehicle.

The test lasted about half an hour and cost seven shillings and sixpence (37.5 pence in today's money).

As well as an ability to manoeuvre the car correctly, candidates had to answer questions about the Government's Highway Code booklet, to pass an eyesight test by reading a nearby number plate and to display knowledge of a range of hand signals, many cars not being equipped with electronic indicators.

It seems that the test achieved its purpose, deaths caused by road accidents falling by 1,000 within a year of its introduction. The figure of around 6,000 still seems astronomical, though, given that on today's highly congested UK roads, the annual death toll is around 1,700.

Traffic Alert - Please could you make your members aware of this if you have a match at Wellington BC after June 15th.

We have been advised that the M5 slip roads (both directions) at junction 26 for Wellington will be closed from 9pm on June 15th, until mid-late September. Northbound traffic will need to leave at junction 27 (Tiverton) and follow the A38 to Wellington. Hopefully, this shouldn't be too disruptive as most traffic heading north to Wellington would use this junction anyway. However, southbound traffic will need to come off at junction 25 (Taunton) and follow the A358 into Taunton and then the A38 south towards Wellington. This will be disruptive creating inevitable delays and visiting teams following this route are advised to give themselves extra time if they can? Teams from the east should use the A303 then approach Wellington across the Blackdown hills avoiding Taunton M5 altogether.

f you are unable to fulfil any of the matches by the deadline, please let the Competitions Committee know.


If you need to pull out of a competition, please do not forfeit the match as there may be reserves who can take your place – Please let the Competitions Committee know.

Safeguarding

Following on from last months information regarding Developing Safer Sports Environments, and as promised this article will look at **the Pyramid of Harm**, shown on the next page.

The pyramid assists us to recognise harmful behaviours ranging from lack of respect to violence. The attitudes and actions of the bottom tiers reinforce and excuse those higher up. These attitudes and behaviours are not isolated but systematic. The behaviours at each level negatively impact individuals and groups but as you move up the levels the behaviours have more life changing consequences.

Level 1 - Biased Attitudes and Beliefs

Sexism Colonialism Misogyny Racism Classism Transphobia Homophobia Xenophobia Ageism Disablism Ableism

Level 2 - Prejudices and Microaggressions

Slurs Offensive Jokes Shaming Cat-calling Dress code Misrepresentation Social Exclusion

Microaggressions – a term used for common place verbal, behavioural or environmental slights, whether intentional or unintentional, that communicate hostile derogatory of negative attitudes about a person's identity.

Examples of microaggressions experienced...

By BAME (Black, Asian and Minority Ethnic people)

'You are well spoken and articulate' said in a surprised tone.

'Where are you really from?'

Being asked to produce identification.

Having ideas dismissed but it becomes a great idea if a non BAME suggests it.

By Women

Assertive females are 'bossy', assertive males are good leaders.

Being interrupted or talked over.

It being assumed women are in more junior roles to men.

By LGBT+

'You don't look trans'

'You don't act gay'

An assumption that one LGBT+ person will automatically like/be friends will another LGBT+ person.

Not using the requested pronouns and insisting on using he/she.

By disabled people

'You don't look disabled'

Telling someone with depression that we all get depressed at time.

Being given assistance without being asked (during training a wheelchair user said they didn't need help loading their wheelchair into the car but they would be grateful for someone to hold an umbrella over them while they did it when raining)

Level 3 - Verbal Expression

Harassment Putdowns Humiliation Threats Name calling Sexual Jokes Marginalisation Sense of superiority Stereotypical statements

Level 4 – Physical Expression

Groping Physical Assault (victim blaming) Sexual Assault Exploitation Control Infliction of pain Vandalism

Stalking – 4 signs Fixated, Obsessive, Unwanted and Repeated

Level 5 – Murder/Suicide


Life changing events where the perpetrator has taken things to the extreme or where the victim has felt there is only one way out left to them.


